Dear Parents and Students

May I take this opportunity to welcome parents of our incoming Year 7's of 2014 to their second Newsletter.

The fact that you are still reading is positive and, despite my own peculiar way of looking at life, I sincerely hope you will have many happy years in Mazenod and many moments of lighthearted humour with all of us who form the Mazenod Community.

Usually I ignore letters, emails or messages to me which are unsigned or anonymous. I feel that if someone has something to say to me then they should be convinced enough to sign themselves and, if necessary, discuss the issues involved.

However, this week I came upon an exception to this rule. A person rang to criticize what I write in my Newsletters as inappropriate for children and preferred to remain anonymous on the grounds that she felt that whatever was said would find its way into the Newsletter and might even have negative repercussions for her Mazenod student.

Because I sometimes quote comments made by parents or students I can see where this parent is coming from and I can only apologize for any misunderstanding up to now.

I NEVER have, and I NEVER would, quote either a parent or student without DIRECT PERMISSION to do so.

With students I say "I would love to quote that", and, "is that OK?" I have never had a refusal yet.

With parents I email and ask for permission and if this is not forthcoming or even delayed I omit the quote or section I was writing.

The very FIRST value of our Founder, St. Eugene De Mazenod, as outlined in our 'Core Values' of Mazenod College is that:

"We are aware of the dignity of all people."

For me to even contemplate quoting a parent, student or friend of Mazenod without permission would betray the relationship I try to foster with students, parents and friends of our Community and, in so doing I would betray myself as an Oblate.

The SECOND value of Mazenod College, taken from our Founder, is:

"To be close to the people with whom we work and learn from them."

The 'people with whom we work' are our students. The mere idea of using any views of a parent to reflect back on a student would utterly appall me

The idea of the 'sins of the fathers being visited on their sons' is very much an Old Testament idea and it has no place in our modern world and, certainly not, in Mazenod.

I have devoted so much of my column to this topic because I fully accept WHY a parent might feel that I am "not usual" in my style of writing.

Let me assure our Community:

- I always welcome comments – good, bad or indifferent.
- ALL comments are treated as confidential.
- If I wish to use a comment by a parent, student or friend of Mazenod I will ALWAYS seek permission first.
- As a professional and experienced teacher and Principal of an Oblate College I would be deeply hurt if any parent felt that a comment by them (parents) would, in any way, reflect on the student.

As I have said so often, Mazenod is, I truly believe, a very special place and all of us should be so proud of what we have achieved here.

The Newsletter is the tiniest part of what we do. My only desire (for what I write) is that:

- i) We reflect an informality and humour which allows us:
“To be close to the people with whom we work.”
(Mazenod College, Key Value 2.)
- ii) I don't want what I write to be a diary of what parents can read elsewhere in the Newsletter.
- iii) I want the Newsletter to reflect the underlying principles of:
Friendliness, cheerfulness, helpfulness, gentleness, thoughtfulness and honesty.
- iv) I want our Newsletter to encourage parents, students and friends to speak to us rather than to 'turn them off' by our language, seriousness or sense that we are only interested in Religious topics or "School stuff."

I won't admit this too often but I really do NOT know how I will survive without her over the next weeks.

Despite my jokes she is my right arm, left arm and brain!

Next week Term 1 ends and, as always, we finish with our OPEN DAY.

This is perhaps the most important day in our College Calendar.

It is the day when we open Mazenod to others and invite them to see us "as we live together".

For me, it is the most relaxing day in the Year!

I have absolutely nothing to do except hand our College over to our students. They will guide our visitors through Mazenod, they will be honest when answering questions, they will tell you about Mazenod as a "student sees it" (warts an' all) and.... I guarantee that you will come away from your visit wondering if, maybe, your son might be as proud of his school as our boys are.

The annual ACC Swimming Carnival took place at Challenge Stadium on Wednesday 27th March. A squad of 60 swimmers met on the gym steps by 6.45am for the early departure in readiness for our pending competition against rival school CBC Fremantle as well as All Saints College, St Stephen’s School, Newman, St Marks, Sacred Heart and John XIII College. This event culminated the end of nearly two terms of early morning training sessions consisting of gruelling sets, push up pyramids and lung busting laps.

Following a commendable 4th place in 2012, the team had set the task of improving on this result in order to remain in ‘A’ Division. Our toughest competition was going to come from the likes of CBC and St Stephens who boast multiple nationally ranked swimmers. Following the individual events, it was clear that CBC were going to be tough to beat. Our focus then switched to maintaining positions in the relays in an attempt to gain maximum points from each race. Topics of discussion amongst relay swimmers were to not get passed in the final 10 metres, to remain in touch with the lead swimmers and to demonstrate the Mazenod spirit at all times.
